

Shareholder Douglas S. Stanger Appointed Small Business Debtor Trustee in New Jersey by the USDOJ

In this role, Doug's substantial legal, business and turnaround management experience in bankruptcy, including over 30 years of representing debtors and creditors, will support small business owners in alleviating the need for costly Chapter 11 bankruptcy proceedings, helping them to reorganize their debts and save their businesses.

The subchapter V trustee appointment stems from the Small Business Reorganization Act signed into law last summer, which seeks to provide a quicker and less expensive reorganization for small business debtors not otherwise available under chapter 11. In light of the economic impact of the COVID-19 virus on businesses, particularly small businesses, Congress also expanded the relief to those businesses under the SBRA earlier this month with the signing of the CARES Act, as well as other provisions of the Bankruptcy Code.
