Overview (Program Summary)

This presentation will focus on the relationship between fracking and pharmaceuticals. While not well known, the basis for all pharmaceuticals is ethanol. This is a fossil fuel that comes from the same family as ethane, methane and the other gases released in the hydraulic fracturing process. When refined, it can be transported to the chemical manufacturers for the production of the drugs that we use to maintain our health and welfare. Nearly 99% of the pharmaceuticals we use today are based on petrochemicals. Having this feed stock for pharmaceuticals in the Northeast as opposed to in the Gulf is a huge advantage for our region.
