FIRST, DO NO HARM: How to discipline and protect against retaliation when responding to complaints from problem employees

In what is akin to Murphy's Law for employment, employees who are facing performance issues are often the first to file internal complaints, triggering a host of anti-retaliation protections. This has been an increasing trend in the new Covid-19 workplace, where potential complaints abound. When this happens, employers are faced with balancing the duties to investigate, refrain from retaliation, and effectively address performance issues in a situation that is fraught with risk. Attendees will work through real-world scenarios to learn ways to help mitigate this risk and answer such common questions as: are the problem employee's complaints legitimate; if not, how do you discipline an employee for filing a claim in bad faith without appearing to be retaliatory; how do you address the performance issues without fueling a claim for retaliation, and how do you balance the rights of all employees involved? With a dramatic increase in retaliation claims and increasingly savvy problem employees, this presentation will offer thoughtful strategies for analyzing and addressing complaints filed by problem employees to mitigate an increasing risk.
