On Monday, February 13, 2012, Flaster Greenberg was featured in an article in the *Courier-Post* which highlighted the firm's newly installed level two electric car charging station. The charging station is a courtesy for clients who drive electric cars – and an incentive for employees to buy environmentally friendly vehicles.
